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# 1.

## The Project

**'OCEANO NOX'** is my orchestral music project. I would like to present my first orchestral piece through this project. This piece was firstly inspired by Victor Hugo's poem of the same title '**OCEANO NOX'** about 10 years ago and I fell deeply into Hugo's unique emotions.

Someday I have reached the West Sea in Korea. It was dark and I sat in front of the sea for a long time. And at that time, I thought of Hugo's poem. I wanted to capture the sound of the waves, the wind, the moonlight, the lighthouse, and the mood of that time through music.

I am a composer who is greatly influenced by impressionism. *Claude Debussy* who was more spontaneous and casual in his composition , especially '*La mer'* the power of his sophisticated passion fascinated me. *Maurice Ravel* was more attentive to form and craftsmanship. This aspect is evident in the *Daphenis et Chloe.* And *Toru Takemitsu,* built his unique world with impressionistic harmony and beauty of space. In his piece '*A flock into the pentagonal garden',* The composer explained that the work arose from a dream and nature.

Expert from A Conversation with Bruce Duffie :

"As a composer, I am always thinking about relation between nature and music, nature and arts, and my music is very much influenced from nature." And also I was greatly influenced by Spectralism Composer such as Giacinto Scelsi, Tristan Murail, and Gerald Grisey. Since I am a soundsensitive composer, I want to make the most delicate sound as much as I can imagine using various contemporary techniques and Spectralism concepts. Above all, however, harmony and clear structure will lead the music.

I think this work will be the best overall expression of my most important parts, the impressionism aspect. It will be the first work to show my acoustic and instinct that I have been eager to compose since I started music. So I have to choose the orchestral work at this stage.

So, although you can't see it in my music so far, the ultimate goal is to put romance, ideals, and spirituality into music through the exploration of sound, and this piece will be the beginning of that goal.

This piece will be about 25 minutes long, And It will be a large-scale orchestra with fourfold woodwinds.

#### **Excerpt from 'OCEANO NOX'**

Bientôt des yeux de tous votre ombre est disparue. L'un n'a-t-il pas sa barque et l'autre sa charrue ? Seules, durant ces nuits où l'orage est vainqueur, Vos veuves aux fronts blancs, lasses de vous attendre, Parlent encor de vous en remuant la cendre De leur foyer et de leur coeur !

#### **English Translation**



## **3.** Biography



Born in 1987 in Pyeong Taek, Korea, Kwang Ho Cho started violin studies since 1992. Thanks to his father, a great lover of music, he grew up listening to classical, jazz, pop, world music and so on. In 1994, He composed his first opus for violin and piano "Theme and Variation in D minor".

In June 2000, he won 3rd Prize in *Gyeonggi Metropolitan Office of Education Violin Competition*. 1998~2005, he performed in numerous concerts as a violinist in YMCA, Pun-dang, and Nowon Youth Orchestra. In 2007, he entered the College of Music in **Yonsei University**. He quit school where he majored in composition and psychology minored in French literature. Currently Kwangho Cho is a Master student at the **Royal College of Music in London**, studying composition for screen with Dimitri Scarlato, Enrica Sciandrone and Kate Simko. he is a John Barry Scholar for film music, supported by Mrs Barry. In 2008, he founded "SUM", a group of composers that has given a number of concerts since its foundation. In 2009, he followed a masterclass with Thierry Escaich. In 2011, he won the 1st Prize in *George Enescu International Competition for chamber music composition*. In 2012, his works were world premiered at one of Seoul Culture Festival's concerts. In 2013, he won the *Rein Marie Jose Prize (1st prize in 68th Geneva competition).* and 2015, he awarded 'the audience prize' in 2015 *Asian Composers Showcase*. and he awarded 'honorable mention award' in 2017 *Frederic Mompou composition award*, 'Finalists' in 2020 *Berlin Film music competition*.

He conducted in various occasions including the "House Concert by Chang-soo Park", Seoul Creation music festival. He also performed as a pianist Seoul Culture Night, Fringe Festival, etc.And He has also served as a head of jury of International competition including **1st Ise-Shima International Popular Music Composition Competition (2022)** 

He composed pop music while working for Japan's popular music company, performed jazz pieces in Korean concerts, and took part in many K-POP music albums and concerts. and he composed pieces for animations, worked as a music director for musical productions. He has hence attempted working with various kinds of music.

He worked as a music director and a scoring composer for several featurelength films and TV series.

He is mainly engaged in film and concert music.
